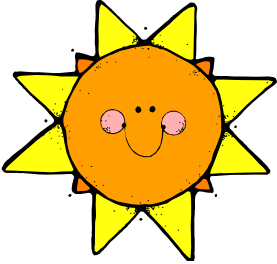

- Drawing supplies (your choice)

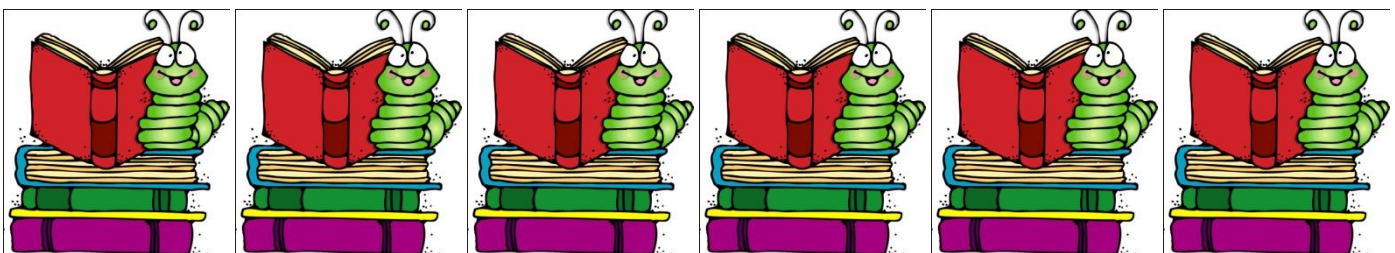


Directions:

**Each answer should be a minimum of two complete sentences. Remember to use correct punctuation and capitalization!

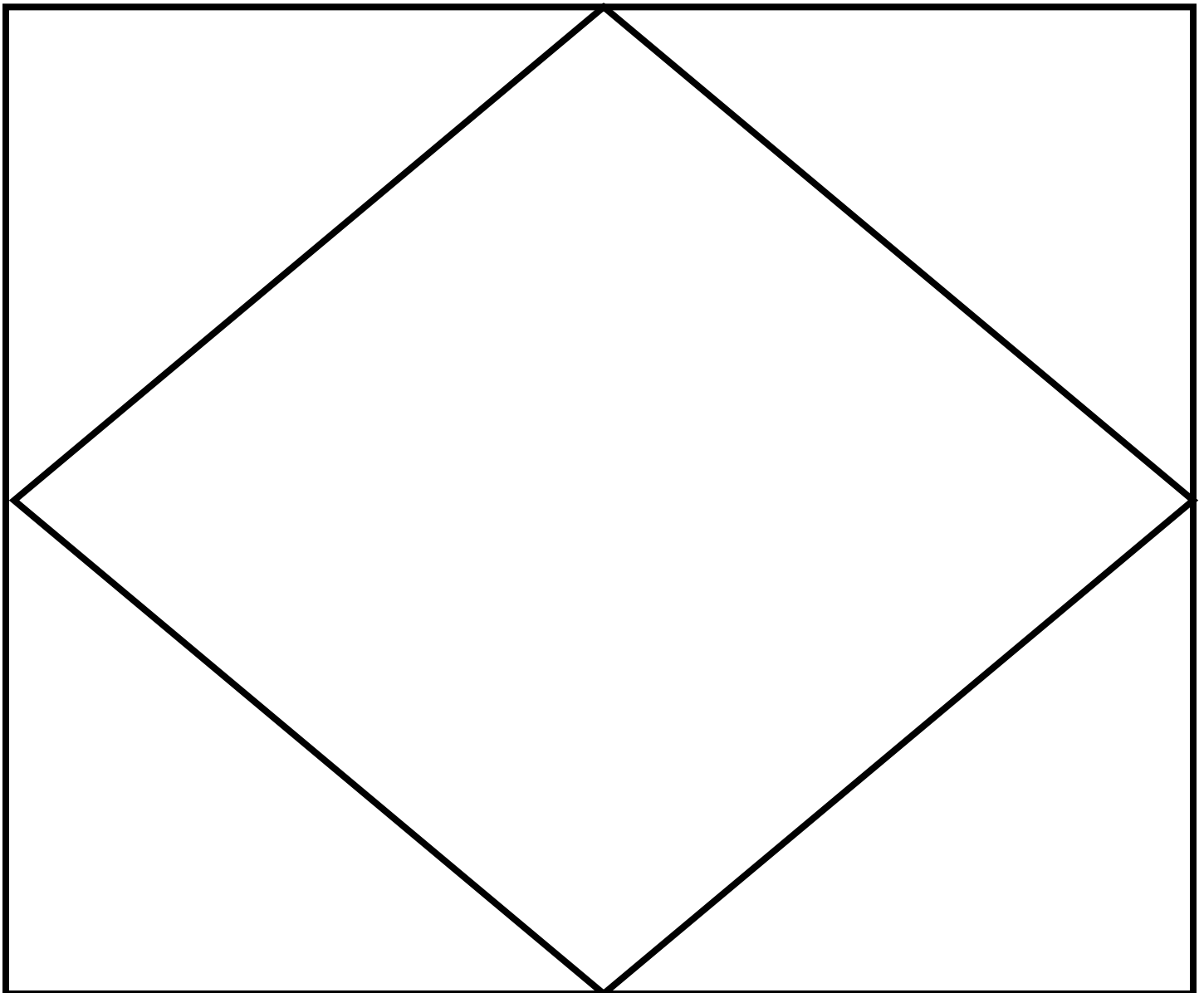
3. Write the name of the book and the author/illustrator on the front of your brown bag.

12. Are there any areas in their social/emotional development you are concerned about (shyness, attention, assertiveness, organization etc.)
